Every once in a while, I come across a reading from the lectionary that has so many important themes I simply cannot cover them all in one sermon, and I find myself thinking and rethinking about it long after the sermon has been written, delivered, and filed away on my shelves.

This is very much true of one of the readings we considered together only a few weeks ago, namely, Jesus' encounter with and subsequent healing of ten men with a skin disease (Luke 17:11-19). Now, as you may recall, we focused our attention on what Jesus did. He saw the men from afar and sent them off to be examined by the priests, and they, of course, were healed as they went. Then, when the one man—a Samaritan man—turned back, Jesus ultimately offered to him the gift of salvation. It is without a doubt an important story about Jesus' engagement with someone living on the margins of society, and it challenges us to consider the people who live on the margins today and our treatment of them.

But, after writing that sermon, I found that I was not only inspired by the love and mercy Jesus embodied, but by the faithful actions of the Samaritan man himself. You see, the Samaritan man could have done what the other nine did. He could have run off to show himself to the priests, and he would have been healed. Indeed, that would have been the obedient thing to do! And yet, he chose to go beyond simple obedience and respond to God's work in his life with all the praise and thanksgiving he could muster. Scripture tells us that while the others went off to the priests, he turned back, praising God with a loud voice, and throwing himself down at Jesus' feet, he gave him thanks.

Now, upon initial inspection, this story from Jesus' life seems relatively simple and straightforward. But I suspect we are actually getting something of a preview here. After all, the same Greek verb (eucharisteō) used here to describe the Samaritan man's act of giving thanks is also used later in the Gospel of Luke to describe Jesus' own action at the supper table on the night of his arrest. There, Jesus gives thanks over the bread, breaks it, and distributes it to his disciples, inviting them (and ultimately us) to not only take the bread and eat it, but to do it all in remembrance of him.

You see, as followers of Jesus, we are invited into a life of thanksgiving, and just as the Samaritan man responded with praise and thanksgiving to Jesus' work in his life, we can respond to God's work in our lives and in the world around us through Jesus not only once a year on Thanksgiving Day, but each and every day that we are given.

May God's grace and peace be with you to strengthen you this holiday season!

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The session met on October 14th and did the following:

- Approved the membership transfer for Gina Struensee from Grace Presbyterian Church in Beaver Dam to First Presbyterian Church of Winneconne.
- Approved the request from Barbara Zimmerman to reactivate her membership with the church.
- Approved a request from Annie Leonard to use the Fellowship Hall on November 30th from 10:30-2:00.
- Heard a report from Rev. Emily on the recent meeting of Winnebago Presbytery.
- Approved the purchase of a replacement desk-top computer for the pastor's office. This is necessary due to age of the current PC (13 years) and the fact that it is incompatible with Windows 11.
- Approved the date of November 9th for a congregational meeting at the close of worship for the purpose of electing new Ruling Elders and Deacons and approving the 2026 Terms of Call for Rev. Emily.
- Heard a report regarding the completion of performance reviews for all part-time staff.
- Reviewed the second draft of the Safe Sanctuary Policy and voted approval with two wording changes to specify that civil authorities will be notified in the event of an incident.
- Approved the time of 5:30 PM for the Christmas Eve worship service.
- Received information regarding two cemetery plots gifted anonymously to the church in 2004 and voted to sell the two plots for a total of \$2,000. Members and friends of the congregation will be given first opportunity to purchase until November15th, at which time the opportunity will be offered to the public.
- Voted to approve a rent increase for Bible Baptist Church effective January 1, 2026 with a two-year guarantee on the increased rate.
- Agreed by consensus that the per capita rate for 2026 will be \$41 per member.

Worship and Faith Formation

ADVENT CANDLELIGHTING READERS NEEDED:

Each year members are invited to lead the lighting of the advent candles at the beginning of worship each Sunday in Advent. At least two people are needed each week plus Christmas Eve starting November 30th. A sign-up sheet will be in the entry or let Rev. Emily or Marilyn Paulson know you'd be interested. Couples, friends, or families with children or grandchildren are encouraged to participate. The readings will be provided.

LAY READERS ALWAYS NEEDED!

Volunteer to assist Rev. Emily during worship as a lay reader. This involves reading some prayers and a scripture passage. Information is sent out ahead of time. Sign-up sheets are in the entryway at church, or you can let Rev. Emily know of your willingness to help.

WORSHIP NEWS

Remembrance Sunday, November 2nd: Each year near All Saints Day we honor loved ones who have died in the past year. If you would like to remember someone you are invited to bring one or more small candles to light during the service. There will be a table in front of the sanctuary for you to set the candle, and lighting will take place during worship.

Christmas Eve Worship: As you begin planning for the holiday season, please note that Session has approved holding this year's Christmas Eve Service at 5:30 pm, Wednesday, December 24th.

FAITH FORMATION OPPORTUNITIES

SACK LUNCH AND SACRED STORIES: The new weekly Bible study that began in September has been very well received. All are invited to join Rev. Emily and others each Tuesday from noon to 1:00 pm. Bring a sack lunch, your favorite Bible, and join in a discussion about some of the scriptures for upcoming Sunday worship.

ADVENT DEVOTIONAL: Slow down, pay attention, DRAW NEAR, this Advent. This year's Advent devotional is Draw Near: Lighting the Advent Path with Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love, written by Rev. Teri McDowell Ott who is a pastor, writer, and editor of Presbyterian Outlook magazine. It offers "a gentle invitation to draw near – to scripture, to stillness, and to the heart of God." Each day's reading includes a scripture, a commentary, a suggested activity for reflection, a prayer, and some artwork from children.

Advent begins Sunday, November 30th. Several printed copies will also be available at the church starting November 23. In addition, the weekly email updates will include a link for each week's readings during the season.



The Christmas Joy Offering is held during the Advent and Christmas season, starting November 30th through December 21st.

Each year through the Christmas Joy Offering, we reflect God's perfect gift to us, with generous support of church leaders among us — past, present and future — who have pointed us to God.

Jesus' example as a child born to be among us and lead us to eternal life provides a pattern for us to follow as we celebrate those who have led us in the past and will lead us into the future.
