Advent Devotions

While we did not get an Advent Devotional this year, we encourage you to read the following scripture texts prior to worship each week. Our Pulpit Supply leaders have selected a theme throughout the season to learn about some of the overlooked characters in the traditional Christmas Story. The themes are as follows:

December 3 – The birth of John the Baptist foretold – Luke 1:1-25

December 10 - Mary's song - Luke 1:57-80

December 17 - Jesus' genealogy - Luke 3:22-38

December 24 (AM) – The Promise of Messiah and Comfort my People – Jeremiah 33:14-18 and Isaiah 40:1-11.

December 24 (PM) – Jesus' birth and the Shepherds and Angels – Luke 2:1-20.

Advent Book Study

An Unlikely Advent by Rev. Rachel Billups

The Advent Study will continue to meet after worship on Dec. 3, 10, and 17 (following the congregational meeting). You are welcome to attend any or all. The book can be purchased on Amazon.com.

Unfortunately the first session for Nov. 26 was canceled. The revised schedule is as follows:

December 3 – Chapter 1: "What if I Missed It?". We will learn from Zechariah and Elizabeth that God's plans often differ from our own, but if we trust God we are blessed in unexpected ways. The texts are Luke 1:5-25, 57-64 and Genesis 18:1-15.

December 10 – Chapter 2: "Playing the Villain". (King Herod was jealous and obsessed with power and he committed unspeakable atrocities. But God's grace is available to all regardless of what they've done – or what we've done – and that is good news!) and Chapter 3: "A Curious People". (Jesus and his family were Jewish and the Gospel writers explain how he was the messiah the Jewish people were waiting for. Early in Jesus' story we meet the Magi from the east who were not Jewish. They teach us how Jesus was a savior for all people.) The primary text for both lessons is Matthew 2:1-12.

December 17 – Chapter 4: "When God Shows Up". (The Shepherds were the first people outside of Jesus' family to hear the good news of his birth. They had difficult jobs and were frightened by the angels' presence but nonetheless responded to God's sign setting an example for followers of Christ still today.) The text for this session is Luke 2:8-20



A NOTE FROM THE PNC

I want to share some straight talk with you about the search process for a new pastor. We have heard that some of you have concerns or are disappointed that we merged the search with our brothers and sisters in Weyauwega. I will tell you that this decision was no one's first choice. It is a strategy to increase our chances of finding a pastor. The simple fact is that there are more churches in our denomination looking for a pastor than there are pastors looking for a new call. Pastors looking for a less than full-time position are few and far between. Both congregations have been without dedicated pastoral leadership for over two years.

Neither Winneconne nor Weyauwega, on their own, can support a fulltime pastor for more than a few years and would be relying on investments to supplement the giving of members to pay the salary and benefits package of a pastor, which approaches \$90,000 for 2024.

Our decision to join forces with Weyauwega coincided with the rollout of a new software system at the denomination level, known as the CLC, which attempts to match churches and pastors who are searching---similar to an online dating app.

If any of you have experience with new software applications, you know that there are usually hiccups and bumps in the initial days of use. That has been the case with the CLC. There is a learning curve for everyone trying to use the new process. However, the ministry profile that we wrote is "live" on the system and we have had some interest expressed by a few pastors. We have also received compliments that our ministry profile is very well written. This gives us confidence that God will answer our prayers and send us a new leader.

As members of this congregation, the PNC needs your prayers and participation. Sign up to be a liturgist or communion server or help at the thrift store the fourth Saturday of each month. The nominating committee is still looking for two persons to serve as Ruling Elders—one for a 2-year term and one 3-year term. Vacancies for these positions do not present a very healthy picture to someone considering a move to the Fox Valley. This church continues to make a positive impact in this community and thru world mission, but it requires all of us. May it be so.

Thanks in part to support from this Offering, church workers can receive critical financial assistance to support them through life's challenging circumstances. These generous actions bear witness to our faithful response to God's charge to love one another as Christ commanded. \$1.1 million of gifts from the 2022 Offering are being used to provide critical financial support and grants for current and retired Presbyterian church workers in their times of need. Income supplements helped nearly 272 individual recipients, assisting retired church workers and surviving spouses with the means to provide for themselves. Housing supplements helped more than 223 individual recipients remain in their homes, afford assisted living, or long-term care. Emergency Assistance Grants helped more than 621 individual recipients facing times of great financial need or uncertainty due to unforeseen circumstances.
