Our meeting was dominated by Worship Committee requests and proposals. During our meeting we approved the following:

- We approved returning to one service at 9:00am, starting on June 20, 2021.
- Masks will no longer be required for members who have been full vaccinated.

- Enforcement will be on the honor system. We will continue to sit in alternating marked pews to follow social distancing requirements.
- Approved the request from the Baptist Church to worship in sanctuary without masks. They will sit in opposite marked pews we use.
- Approved having fellowship inside in Fellowship Hall from 10:00am to 10:30am.

We discussed singing by the congregation and the choir, but decided to wait until this fall to bring it up again. This means we will allow singing by music leader only.

# Reverend Rosie's Reflections: Separation Ethics

In the PCUSA, as well as other denominations, policies have been put into place about Pastoral relationships with members of the congregation after a pastor leaves.


The policies are very clear about performing pastoral functions, like weddings and baptisms. Once a pastor has vacated a position, and the relationship is dissolved, that minister may NOT offer any pastoral acts, attend worship, or offer pastoral support without the session moderator's consent. This is to allow the church to transition to new leadership, and develop relationships with the pastors who come after.

The place where this gets harder is with social media, and friendships which have been developed within the church. I have begun the process of removing church members from my Facebook account, and will continue this process over the next month. This is not meant as an insult or to hurt anyone. This is in order to help maintain healthy boundaries and allow other leadership to begin to fulfill the roles of the Church.

If you have questions about separation ethics, or would like to see the policies from the Presbytery, I am happy to share them.

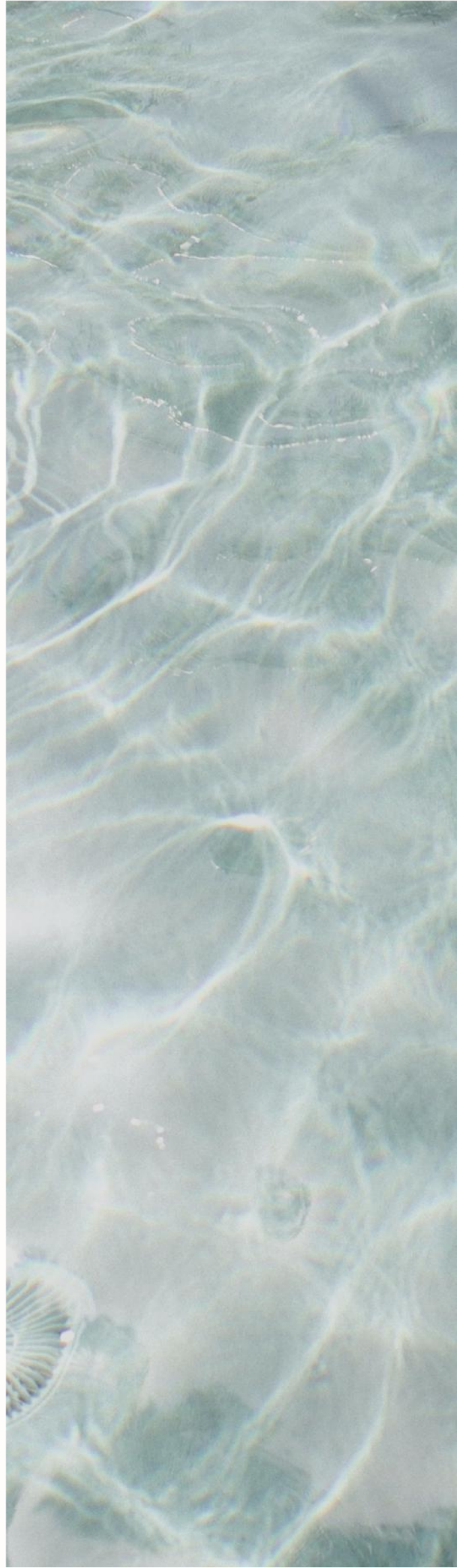
## Member Care

First Presbyterian Church will once again participate in the 23rd annual Community Back to School Fair. The goal is to assist over 1,000 lower income families in the Oshkosh and Winneconne area in getting their children supplied with basic clothing and school supplies, in preparation for the 2021/2022 school year. Personnel from social service agencies and school staff identify those families and students with the most significant needs. Last year, a total of eighteen churches from Winneconne and Oshkosh supported this event.

You are invited to “Share God’s Love and Shine God’s Light” by supporting the Back to School Fair. There will be a “Christmas in July” tree in the church entryway with backpack tags identifying clothing items that may be purchased. There will be a box next to the tree where you may place the purchased clothing items. 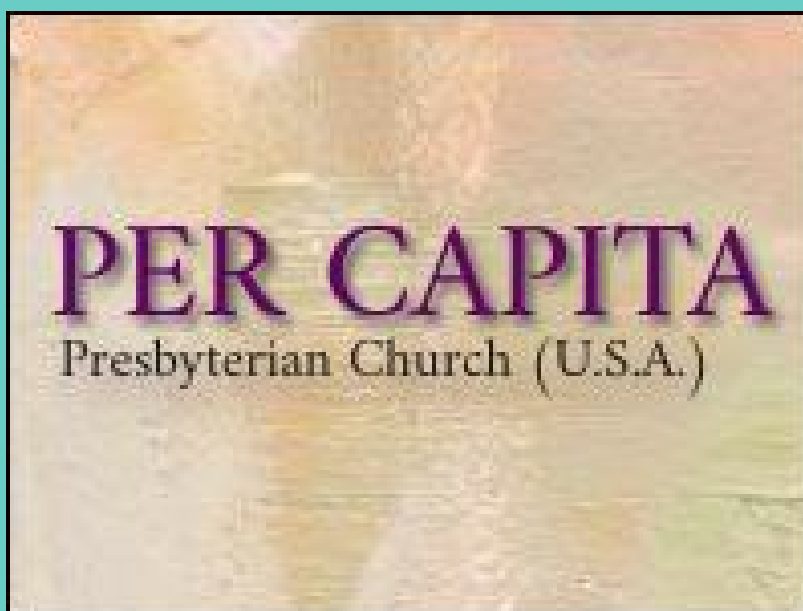
