

#### **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**

The Session met on September 9th.

- Rev. Emily is planning an outdoor pet blessing event on Saturday,
   October 11th from 2:00 to 3:30 PM.
- The Session approved a motion from the Mission and Outreach Ministry Team to split the local mission budgeted amount of \$1000 equally between the Winneconne Community School District Emotional Wellness Fund and the Winneconne Schools Basic Needs Fund.
- The Session approved a motion from the Mission / Outreach Team to designate 25% of the gifts received for the Peace and Global Witness Offering to support the newly established Winneconne After School Program being offered by the Boys & Girls Club. Promotion will culminate on World Communion Sunday, October 5th.
- The first draft of a Safe Church Policy was presented; some changes were suggested. A second draft will be available at the October Session meeting.
- Plans for the September 17th dinner were finalized.
- The Nominating Committee will present a full slate of candidates who have answered the call to serve as Deacons and Ruling Elders beginning in 2026.
