SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Session met on February 14th and took the following action:

• Approved the 2022 Church Statistical Report that is submitted to the denomination. One area of note in the report is the age distribution of our 75 active members.

- 17 & under 3
- **18-25 5**
- **26-40 2**
- **41-55 9**
- 56-70 17
- Over 70 39

Approved a proposal to celebrate and honor the DiVall family bequest and live up to our Mission Statement of Sharing God' Love and Shining God's Light. The following gifts will be made to support our neighbors locally and around the world.

- \$5,500 to Winneconne Area Assistance Center
- \$30,000 to the Winneconne Area Foundation for the Winneconne Community School District Emotional Wellness/Mental Health Fund. (This fund was originally started by our church in 2017.)
- \$10,000 to the Presbyterian Mission Agency for the purchase of two community farm bundles, each of which will provide enough livestock, tools and training to support a larger farm that can serve an entire community. (Bill Divall was the agriculture teacher at Winneconne High School for 30 years.)
- \$3,000 to the Presbyterian Mission Agency for the purchase of two garden wells. (Bernice DiVall was a gardener in her earlier years.)
- \$1,500 to Vinnies Pantry, a food pantry in Neenah which serves northern Winnebago County. RE Marilyn Paulson assisted with the start-up of this agency, has volunteered in the pantry since its inception and serves on its Coordinating Committee.

The reading/discussion schedule is as follows:

- March 5 Chapter 2: Hate Father and Mother.

- For whom and what is "slavery" a metaphor?

March 19: Chapter 4: Nowhere Among the Gentiles

- Who is worthy of our time and attention?

March 26: Chapter 5: Outer Darkness

- Matthew 5:27-30; Luke 13:22-30; Matthew 18:23-35
- What do the Gospels really say about "hell"?

- John 8:31-59
- Examine insulting language that John's Gospel depicts Jesus using against some of his fellow Jews, language of a type that has been used to justify anti-Jewish hatred and violence for over 2000 years.

MARCH 2023 - FLOUR FOODS

Cornbread

- 2 cups corn meal
- 1/2 cup wheat flour
- 1 cup sweet milk
- 1 cup sour milk
- 1/4 cup molasses
- legg
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon butter
- 1 teaspoon baking soda

Bake one hour or steam two hours.

MISSION & OUTREACH

It's that time of year again! It's time for "One Great Hour of Sharing." Maybe you are well versed in this special offering that has been happening for more than 70 years and are ready to make your donation! Or maybe you are like me and need a reminder of what this is all about.

Typically received during the season of Lent, One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) supports efforts in 3 areas.

(1) Relieve hunger through the Presbyterian Hunger Program. Donations in 2021 supported 80 grants totaling nearly \$1 million impacting 23 countries, including the United States.

(2) Promote development through the Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People. This committee works with low-income communities both in the United States and internationally to overcome oppression and injustice.

(3) Assist in areas of disaster through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). The PDA has offered resources and support to those impacted by the war in Ukraine, Hurricane Ian and the recent Turkey-Syria earthquake.

OGHS provides us a way to share God's love with our neighbors in need. In fact, OGHS is the single, largest way that Presbyterians come together every year to work for a better world.

We will receive this special offering on Palm Sunday (April 2) and Easter Sunday (April 9) – but you can donate anytime via the special offering envelopes in the pews.


