WORSHIP & FAITH FORMATION

Join us Thursday, April 6 for a Maundy Thursday Fellowship Meal and Worship starting at 6:00 pm.



The meal will include foods that may have been served in first century Jerusalem, and a Taize style worship service with communion will follow. Both will take place in Fellowship Hall.

The menu includes Lentil Stew, assorted breads, almonds, figs, dates, olives, Haroset, cheesecake, bread pudding and beverage. Baskets will be available for donations toward the food.

Taize style worship offers a quiet, peaceful, meditative, prayerful approach in order to sense God in our midst. It includes words of scripture, prayer, and repetitive singing of simple refrains. It is slower paced with more silence that you might be used to, but it is in that silence that we can have a deeper connection with the sacred. Taize prayer is often described as being "between ourselves and God and there is no between."

The Taize Community is a little village in Burgundy, France. In 1940 a Protestant priest began an ecumenical monastic community there. Thousands of people journey there each year to experience the power of God's spirit through daily study, fellowship, and prayer in that unique setting. We hope you will find peace this Holy Week in our faith community's fellowship and worship.



LENTEN DEVOTIONAL

During lent, FPC has provided links to access a Lent devotional provided by the Presbyterian Outlook. The theme is "Examen: Inward Work for Outward Living". It will have us explore our inward contemplations and our outward actions by noticing where God's grace is present each day.

The reading/discussion schedule is as follows:

<u>April 2 - Chapter 5: Outer Darkness</u> Matthew 5:27-30; Luke 13:22-30; Matthew 18:23-35 What do the Gospels really say about "hell"?

<u>April 16 - Chapter 6: Your Father the Devil</u> John 8:31-59

Examine insulting language that John's Gospel depicts Jesus using against some of his fellow Jews, language of a type that has been used to justify anti-Jewish hatred and violence for over 2000 years.


