## Notes from Member Care

The Deacons at First Presbyterian are able to assist with Home Communions where we are needed. If you know of someone who would like to have this sacrament brought to them, please let one of us know so we can be sure to make this happen. Receiving communion is a deeply meaningful time for each of us individually, and it is important that we not overlook anyone who may not be able to get to church for any reason. We generally go in pairs to share the elements and it is one of our joys to be able to provide it.

We have been talking about having an outdoor service sometime during the summer, and perhaps this could even be combined with a picnic for our membership. There is still time to plan for such an event and if you have an idea or suggestion for this, we encourage you to call or talk to one of us or send an email with your suggestion. ## AN UPDATE FROM THE PNC

The Pastor Nominating Committees from both Winneconne and Weyauwega met together on May 22. The outcome of that meeting was a decision to work together to search for one full-time pastor to serve both churches. This was announced in worship on June 4th and in the June Bridge. A subgroup from each PNC then met via Zoom on June 16th to determine a plan to move forward. Leslie Gunter, COM Coordinator from the Presbytery office, was present to explain the new process that was launched in early June by the CLC (Church Leadership Connection). All churches seeking a pastor and clergy seeking a new church will be using the new process. There are new forms which both churches and pastors must complete. So, that becomes the primary task as we begin the process of searching for one pastor for both churches. While each congregation will be recognized by a few specific such as membership number, average attendance, community type and cultural composition, the responses to the remainder of the form must be agreed upon by both groups. A meeting of both PNCs is scheduled for June 29th in Weyauwega.

In order to create a joint PNC with equal representation from both churches, Winneconne will need to adjust the number of persons on the PNC. We are also taking this opportunity to invite anyone else from the congregation who may have an interest in becoming part of the joint PNC to step forward. If you have such an interest, please contact Kristina Mosely, our current PNC chairperson.

Please continue to pray for our church and the PNC as we eagerly await the person whom God will send to lead the two congregations.

# **FAITH FORMATION**

#### SUMMER SUNDAY PSALMS

Our series highlighting the Psalms continues this month with the reading of Psalms 1, 25, 42, and 121. Our pulpit supply preachers have selected the requested ones and will continue the series through August.

The Book of Psalms is a collection of five books, probably related to the fact that there are five books of the Law (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy), and the Psalms are seen as a companion to those. It is the only book in the Bible that is actually written to God over a period of nearly 1,000 years. Through the Psalms we learn about the importance of prayer, the acknowledgment of pain, the power of praise, and fulfillment of prophecy. This book has been designed as a prayer book for God's people as they wait for the fulfillment of God's promises.

The 150 Psalms each end with a brief "doxology", or word of glory as an expression of praise. Thanksgiving, Lament, Praise, Trust, and Royal Psalms (referring to the King of Israel) are the book's major categories. Psalms elicit a variety of emotions for God's people: fear, anger, praise, gratitude, joy, and despair, and they make it ok for us to be real with God.

Our anticipated income is not keeping pace with our expenses. We know that the summer months offer many opportunities for get-togethers with family and friends, as well as travel, that do not always allow us to attend church. If you have not already paid your Per Capita, please do so as soon as possible. The 2023 Per Capita is \$38 per member.

Per capita is about community. It is about committing to connection and support between all members of the Presbyterian Church (USA). It is about joining together and being one body, the body that is Christ's church in the world.

When a congregation gives to per capita, the gifts first go to the presbytery and synod. Each of these mid councils determines the per capita rate for their work and how they allocate denominational per capita from the congregation's overall per capita gift. Typically, the per capita dollars which move through mid councils to the denomination are around 25% of the total per capita given, with 75% going to mid councils and their ministries. ~From PCUSA Office of the General Assembly Per Capita annual

Winnebago Presbytery set the Per Capita rate for 2023 at \$38. That amount is split between the presbytery, the synod, and the General Assembly. That \$38 is split up at \$22.65 for the Presbytery, \$5.50 for the Synod, and \$9.85 for General Assembly. We're officially half way through the year; if you haven't already sent in your per capita, please do so as soon as you are able.
