Celebrations:

Kristina Mosley presented the Ministry Information Form, which was completed by the Pastor Nominating Committee. Session approved the document, as well as an effective salary range of \$45,000 to \$52,000 for the three-quarter time pastor position.

Prior to ordering offering envelopes for 2023, all members will be contacted as to their need for envelopes. The number of regular electronic payments to the church has increased, thereby eliminating the need for weekly envelopes. Inactive persons on the membership roll will also be contacted as to their wishes to remain as members.

Following a lengthy discussion of the recent document from the Wisconsin Council of Churches regarding the safe return to in-person worship, Session passed a motion to follow the current CDC guidelines. Wearing a mask will be a personal choice. Those persons who feel more comfortable wearing a mask will always be welcome to worship in person.

The 2021 year-end financials showed that income exceeds expenses by a total of \$32,579. The surplus is due to the departure of Pastor Rose in July. December income was \$20,564; December expenses totaled \$12,675 for a net gain of \$7,889.

The BIG (Building, Grounds, and Infrastructure) Team will be conducting a review of the insurance coverage for the church.

The Member Care Team will host a special fellowship time following the Easter service.

SEASONS OF FEAST AND FAMINE

In Genesis Chapter 41, Joseph was asked to interpret the Pharaoh's dreams. Joseph told Pharaoh what was going to happen. All of Egypt would have seven years of great plenty and then seven years of great famine. Because the Pharaoh had the dream twice, this established what was to come to pass. Pharaoh appointed Joseph to oversee the saving and storing of food during the seven years of plenty. Seven years of famine then occurred over all the face of the earth. Egypt was able to provide food for themselves and others during the seven years of famine because of their preparation and willingness to follow God's Word.

Years ago, the Board of Deacons asked the members to share of their sewing supply abundance. The Deacons' Room overflowed with material, thread, yarn, elastic, pins, needles, lace, and ribbon. 
