LENT 2023

LENTEN DEVOTIONAL:

Later this month, we will provide a weekly link for this year's Lenten Devotional from Presbyterian Outlook. The theme of this devotional is "Examen: Inward Work for Outward Living". It will utilize the spiritual practice known as 'Examen' to explore both personal inner contemplations and outward actions. Examen is a process through which one becomes aware of their consciousness (state of mind, feelings, thoughts, reactions, interactions, etc.) during various events that occur throughout one's day and notice where God's grace has been present, and then reflect on how one has responded to God's presence. May you find the season an occasion of spiritual refreshment as we journey together toward Easter.

LENTEN BOOK STUDY:

Each Sunday during Lent (February 26 – April 2) Lisa Baltes and Marilyn Paulson will facilitate a study of the book "The Difficult Words of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to His Most Perplexing Teachings", by Dr. Amy-Jill Levine.

This book discusses how Jesus' challenging teachings (such as Sell What You Own, Hate Father and Mother, Slave of All, and more) would have sounded to the people who first heard them, how they have been understood over time, and how we might interpret them in the context of the gospel of love and reconciliation.

Dr. Levine is an internationally known scholar, teacher, author, and professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Vanderbilt Divinity School. A review of this book states, "With her bold signature style, she combines her sharp intellect with humor and a bit of imagination to bring these challenging texts alive..." (Dr. Jamie Clark-Soles, professor of New Testament, Perkins School of Theology.)

The text for the first session on Sunday, February 26 is the story of Jesus and the Rich Man in Mark 10:17-27. Marilyn will have books available at church beginning February 5. Loneliness this time of year is not uncommon, and we want to be there for our church family in whatever ways are needed.

Another goal is to always be up on who is responsible for whom in terms of Deacons caring for church members. We will each have a complete list of all members and who takes the lead for whom. This does not mean that only one specific deacon can provide whatever is needed. It is more importantly to be sure nobody falls through a crack and gets overlooked. If we all know the complete list, we can all serve better!

Every week we say: "Our worship service is over; Our service in the world begins." We take that very seriously. For example, after Jessica's sermon on January 22, we learned that depression lives within and among many. We learned from Melissa that 9% of children in Winnebago County are "food insecure". Both of these facts provide us with a direction for our service, and we will always respond as best we know how.

FEBRUARY 2023 - SOUPS

Soup Stock & Broth

- Purchase a good meaty soup bone. Put it on boil as early after the morning meal as possible.
- Salt and cover with cold water.
- Season with onion, cabbage and celery, cook thoroughly, then strain.

Resulting liquid will make a good meat soup stock, with which you can make barley, rice, or noodle soup.

Barley Soup

Soak 1 cup of pearl barley for two hours and add to hot soup stock an hour before serving. Rice may be used instead of barley.

Corn Soup

- Chop 1 can of corn or 6 ears of fresh corn
- Add corn and 1 sliced onion to 1 qt. chicken stock
- Simmer for 10 minutes then rub through sieve
- Melt 2 1/2 tbsp. of butter and stir into 2 1/2 tbsp. of flour until well blended together
- Add to soup and strain
- Finish by adding 1 c. of sweet cream

Have some kernels of nicely popped corn put on top of bowls of soup before serving.


