Believe it or not, in just a few short weeks, we will kick off the holiday season with family and friends gathered together at table for some delicious food and meaningful fellowship on Thanksgiving Day. SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Session met on October 8th.

- The Session will host a joint meeting with the Weyauwega Session on November 6th. The purpose of the meeting is to negotiate the 2025 Terms of Call for Pastor Emily and share thoughts on the Shared Pastoral Services Agreement which has been in effect for the first five months of our new relationship.
- Jessica Harrison's name will be submitted to Winnebago Presbytery Commission on Ministry so that Jessica may continue to be commissioned to preside at the table for Holy Communion in our church in 2025.
- The Session heard the highlights of the September 26th meeting of Winnebago Presbytery, which included an announcement by the Leadership Commission that they approved a grant of \$1000 to our very own Young Adult Volunteer, Robbie Mosley. Each YAV needs to raise \$4,000 to cover expenses during their year of service. Robbie is currently working in New Orleans.
- Updated policies for the Administrative Manual of Operations are being reviewed. The final product will be shared with the congregation upon completion and approval.

Worship and Faith Formation

- Our Service of Remembrance will be held Sunday, November 3rd.

 Members are invited to bring a small candle to be lit during the service in remembrance of a loved one who has died this past year.
- Readers and candle lighters are needed for the lighting of Advent Wreath candles during Decemeber beginning Sunday, Decemeber 1st. At least two people will be needed for each of 5 services. Please let Marilyn Paulson or Rev. Emily know if you would like to participate. Readings will be provided.

- This Saturday, November 2nd, is Rev. Emily's installation at FPC in Weyauwega at noon. All are welcome to attend!





You may recall that in the summer of 2017, we sold the rental house that the church owned just north of the fellowship hall. In our proposal seeking approval of the plan by Winnebago Presbytery, we pledged to donate 10% of the proceeds of the sale to establish the Winneconne Community School District Emotional Wellness & Mental Health Fund. This fund is part of the Winneconne Area Community Foundation, which in turn is a component of the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation. The purpose of the fund is to help support emotional wellness programs at our Winneconne schools.

While 10% of the sale proceeds came to \$7,000, the Session agreed to donate a total of \$10,000 in order to establish the fund with the foundation. Over the last seven years, the fund has grown because of healthy growth in the investment portfolio and additional donations from community members. At the 10th anniversary celebration of the Winneconne Area Community Foundation, we learned that the fund we established now has a value of \$80,000. First Presbyterian has made and will continue to make a difference in our community. Praise the Lord!!
